Aims and outcomes:

- ✓ Understand the terminology around migration.
- Acquire a general knowledge on processes (such as NTS, NRM, age assessments) and asylum policies young people may experience in the UK.
- Understand the reasons young people flee, and the journey, life and social experiences that have an impact on young people's engagement and mental health.
- Learn about emotional challenges faced by young people and how to support them in a trauma-informed way.
- Gain information and awareness of national agencies and resources to inform and support professionals while working and supporting young people.
- Have a platform to share best practices and learn from others' experiences.
- Receive advice and access support to help young people settle into the community.
